ESTABLISHED IN 1988, THE INTERNATIONAL PRINTING MUSEUM HAS DEVELOPED OVER THE YEARS TO become more than just a repository of Ernie Lindner's great collection of antique presses... it is a living, working experience of the most important invention ever—the printed word! And the LA Printers Fair is a celebration of just that.

When Ernie Lindner began building his beautiful collection of antique printing equipment in the late 1940's, letterpress was still the main commercial process for printing. As a Los Angeles equipment dealer, Ernie would get into the back rooms of many old shops and find their "junk," those obsolete and used printing presses that no longer performed the daily work of the printer. They were destined for the scrap yard but for visionary collectors such as Ernie Lindner. And so he collected for 50 years, building one of the largest collections in the world, with the hope that young printers and artists would someday use those presses again.

In Ernie's day, the term Book Arts was not yet coined; they simply called it Fine Printing—an attention to beautiful printing, paper, type, design and binding. As a tradition, fine printing goes back to the end of the 19th century with the Arts & Crafts Movement and William Morris. The book arts and letterpress revival of today is the inheritor of those ideals of craftsmanship, but with an expansion of expression and creativity. It was always Ernie Lindner's dream to see the presses in his collection to be used and enjoyed by younger generations. Though Ernie died on October 3rd, 2001 his dream is very much alive in the annual Los Angeles Printers Fair at the International Printing Museum held each fall.

Following our 25th Anniversary this last year, the Printing Museum is continuing its Building Campaign to expand and improve the Printing Museum. 

FEATURING THE WORLD FAMOUS LINDNER COLLECTION

The International Printing Museum features the Ernest A. Lindner Collection. Recognized by many authorities as the finest collection in the world, the Lindner Collection spans more than 500 years of graphic communication history.

As a young man, Ernest Lindner began collecting while working for his uncle and father who rebuilt and sold used typesetting equipment in Los Angeles. "We would sell a man a machine and take in trade a piece he was replacing. I couldn't bear to throw away some of these wonderful machines, so I began shoving them into corners, even after there were no more corners!"

E.G. Lindner Co. display at the 1968 printing equipment trade show in Los Angeles. Ever the showman, Ernie used pieces from his collection such as the Typograph to attract attention to his exhibit.

After the death of his father in 1940 and his uncle and namesake, Ernest in 1957, Ernie began collecting in earnest. He combed the world searching for old hand-lever presses and typesetting machines that were the wonders of the machine age and assembled one of the largest and finest collections in the world.

Since 1988, Ernie and his wife, Harriet, personally restored many of the pieces on display at the Printing Museum. Though Ernie passed away in October of 2001, the Museum continues to build his legacy by collecting pieces that in Ernie's words, "we just can't do without!"



Ernie was the national distributor of the Asbern Proof Press, the German version of the nowfamous Vandercook. Every American Asbern has a red plate affixed to it with the name E.G. LINDNER CO., LOS ANGELES.

From sustainable forests to the renewable nature of trees and the recyclability of paper, the print and paper industries have a positive environmental story to tell—one in which print on paper and healthy forests thrive hand-in-hand.

The truth is, print is recyclable, renewable and responsible.

Let's examine the facts:

Paper is Recycled Daily: 87% of Americans have access to curbside or drop-off paper recycling programs and 63.5% of all paper consumed in the United States was recovered for recycling in 2010.

Recovered by Paper Mills: 115 paper mills in the United States used recovered fiber exclusively in 2010, and 289 more, or 77%, used at least some recovered material in their manufacturing process.

More Forests Exist Today: 12 million more acres of forest exist in the U.S. today than 20 years ago.

More Trees are Standing Today: 49% increase between 1953 and 2006 in the number of trees still standing after mortality and harvesting.

More Trees are Planted Daily: 1.7 million trees are planted every day by the U.S. paper and forest products industry; and 600 million annually worldwide.

Is a Small Portion: Just 11% of the world's forests are used for paper (28% for lumber; 53% for fuel).

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
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
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



